For a more subtle vibe, try purposely mixing neutral colours that you wouldn't normally, such as beige and chocolate brown or tan with green or black (Michael Kors, Louis Vuitton, D&G) – and don't forget to mismatch your shoes and suit (Rag and Bone).

For the city boys out there, try wearing a different coloured suit jacket and trousers – or shorts if you're feeling continental. Add an oversized manbag to the ensemble and you'll be ready for action (Viktor and Rolf Louis Vuitton). Make it rock and roll with matching slim-fit dark trousers with a bright waistcoat and matching low cut T-shirt (See Paul Smith), and add a good old pair of boots.

And this trend even works if you like your sports (or lounging at home in your tracksuit): team up your favourite jogging pants with a different colour top (Y-3)
